



Allocation of CEMS Students to CEMS host school and term abroad

1) CEMS student selection and ranking of students:

Based on the CEMS application, the International Relations Center (ZIB) creates a ranking of the CEMS students. This ranking provides the sequence, in which the ZIB allocates the individual student to a partner school.

(Note: The ZIB does not communicate the students' ranks.)

2) Stipulation of CEMS exchange quota:

November:

The 34 CEMS schools stipulate their exchange quota for the following academic year (term 1 and term 2).

4) Allocation to CEMS host school and term abroad:

End of January:

The allocation process starts with the student on top of the ranking ("Student h"). He/ she gets his/her first choice.

Thus, the exchange quota of University AAA in term 1 is reduced by one.

Analogically, the other students are allocated step-by-step to their host school and term. The allocation is summarized in the next table (marked in blue). If students have the same score and the same university choice, the Bachelor GPA will decide. If they also have the same GPA, a draw will decide.
